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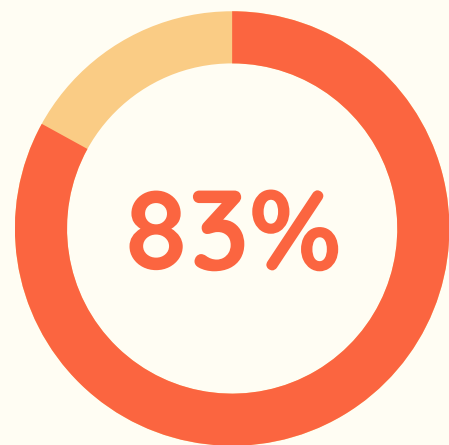

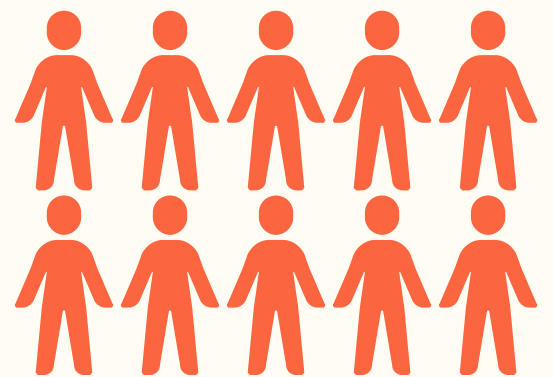
NYH Achieved 83% of its 31 KPIs. This is above the target set for all Humankind Services.

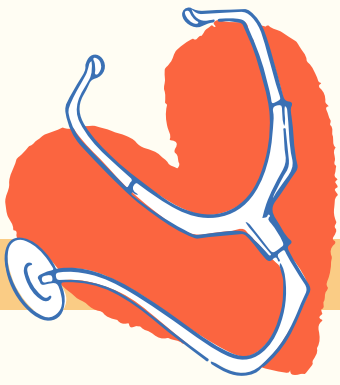

Fibro scanning provision of all individuals identified positive Hepatitis C, 33 people have been fibro scanned.

Hepatitis C - NYH have had 22 successful treatment completions

Aim for micro elimination by summer 2024 - 2 day event planned for May 2024 to focus on Hep C - with use of the Cepheid Machine

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CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Funding of Countywide Prison Link Workers, to support CofC performance and activity in the service.

Roll out of Single Use CofC form across Yorkshire & Humber community and prison providers, to support data capture and sharing

Development and Implementation of new ATR/DRR pathway between NYH/Probation - inclusive of suitability assessments, circulation of court lists, court attendance by NYH to inform sentencing

NYH CofC performance is steadily increasing.



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DRINK DRUG HUB

Website launched in February 2023. Hosts and links to wide range of harm reduction resources, all verified through robust internal processes. Production of own articles also commenced (vaping). Training offer, both face to face and remote.

Overdose Awareness Training delivered August - September 2023 in line with Overdose Awareness Day

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HARM REDUCTION

Advice and Guidance tool developed on the risk of benzos and overdose.



Harm Reduction bulletin developed by our Harm Reduction Lead, circulated to all NYH staff monthly

Increased risk of overdose identified due to COPD - COPD plan in place to improve health outcomes.



Safer sleep training rolled out to all staff and now embedded in pregnancy pathway (all pregnant women and those with children under 1 receive guidance)

Oversight of the new Local Drug Information Service

Led the implementation of the NY drug analysis project across North Yorkshire



Expansion of Naloxone across key providers including TEWV, Probation and North Yorkshire Police.

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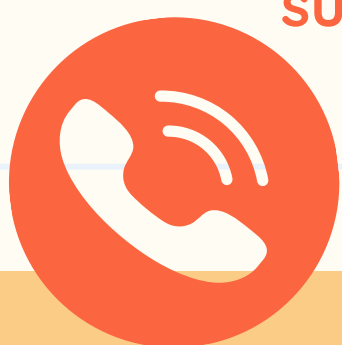
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RECOVERY IN THE COMMUNITY

Increase women's specific offer across NYH - Working with St Giles Trust, Whole system approach

Implementation of Buvidal as a treatment option for people accessing NYH

Micro elimination of Hepatitis C

Roll out of Visionable functionality to allow video calls with people in prison

Development and expansion of MiSMART

Currently working with Local Maternity Networks & Public Health exploring improvements in identifying and prevention of foetal alcohol syndrome in infants
